28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings from Second Kings and the Gospel invite us to reflect on how we respond to God's saving deeds. In each of these readings, we find an individual who recognizes the goodness and healing power of God. In the first instance, Naaman, a Syrian, was a man of high regard in his native land. At the suggestion of his servant girl, and with the permission of his master, Naaman went to Israel to be cleansed of his leprosy. The prophet Elisha had directed Naaman to plunge into the Jordan seven times. Although Naaman's initial reaction to this instruction was one of disgust, he did as he was told, and "his flesh became again like the flesh of a little child, and he was clean of his leprosy" (2 Kgs 5:14). Naaman's response was one of belief in and gratitude for the God of Israel.

In the Gospel from Luke, we are told of ten men who, upon seeing Jesus, call out to him and ask for pity. Jesus' response is simple: "Go show yourselves to the priests." As the ten were obeying this command, "they were cleansed" (17:14). One man, a Samaritan, returned to Jesus and glorified God. While much could be said of each story, what the texts tell us is quite clear. Not everyone responds in the same way to the merciful actions of God. In both of these Scripture readings, the individuals cleansed of their leprosy were foreigners, not men of Israel. Yet bot of them returned to express their gratitude and their recognition of the saving power of God.
