**30<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time**

When Jesus is asked about the greatest commandment, he replies with a dual commandment: love of God and love of neighbor. There is neither opposition nor separation between these two loves, as if one must choose one over the other. One cannot have one without the other. Jesus has no problem then, loving people by understanding their need for food or by healing them on the sabbath, a day that some think should be reserved solely for loving God. The way Jesus juxtaposes these two loves as dual, and the greatest commandment implies that the violation of neighbor violates God and the commandment.
