Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord

Today’s solemnity continues the celebration of the astonishing mystery of God’s manifestation to the very ends of the earth. The visitors from the East symbolize the extent of God’s salvation as it unfolds for peoples of every land. As they offer gifts, as would be fitting for a king, they announce to the world that an astonishing event has taken place; all peoples will know the glory of God. An echo of Isaiah’s prophecy appears in Matthew 2 when Magi from the east (likely Persia) arrive in Jerusalem to pay homage to the newborn king of the Jews. Magi were men of wisdom who studied the stars. They were not themselves kings; rather, they were often servants of kings. This adds another layer of irony to the quiet birth of this new king, who arrives not in the halls of power but in a humble stable in the company of farm animals. The kings should have come to pay tribute to him; instead, the ruling powers (Herod, Augustus Caesar) prove to be unaware or hostile, and the kings’ servants come instead. They bear two of the gifts name in Isaiah (gold and frankincense) plus myrrh, a costly perfume sometimes used to anoint the dead. The wisdom of the Magi reflects Paul’s observation in Ephesians that the mystery of God’s grace was made known by revelation. The Magi learn of the birth of Jesus through the stars, are guided to his cradle by a star (in the ancient world, stars can be angels), and are warned in a dream not to return to Herod. While the Magi may not have known which Spirit guided them, the apostle Paul does. The mystery of salvation is that these Magi from the east are not only heralds of God’s grace but are themselves invited to be coheirs with the Jews, adopted into God’s promises.

Again, an ancient tradition of the Church is to bless homes on the feast of the Epiphany. Simply take some chalk (or other implement) and trace **20+C+M+B+12** above or at the entrance to your home. Then the family prays together: Lord God of heaven and earth, You reveal Your son to every nation by the guidance of a star. Bless our home and all who live here. Fill us with the light of Christ that our love of others may truly reflect Your love. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen Remember, wise men and women still seek Him!
