#### The Resurrection of the Lord

1st Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:34-43 – On Easter Sunday morning, the 1st Reading takes us to the home of Cornelius, a devout man who was also a Roman centurion. He has had a vision in which he has been instructed to send for Peter, who also has had a vision that calls into question the Jewish food purity rules about which animals are clean versus unclean. In this passage, we hear Peter recount the story of the life, Death, and Resurrection of Jesus Christ. While all he has accomplished has been witnessed to by the prophets, the redemption of the Risen Christ has been accomplished for all people, including the gentiles. Anyone who believes and bears witness to him will be forgiven. 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading: Colossians 3:1-4 – This reading exhort the followers of Jesus Christ to set aside the old self and old life in favor of the new life they have been given in Christ. Gospel: John 20:1-9 - Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary, the mother of James and others came to Jesus' tomb bringing spices to anoint his body. Remember the magi's gift of myrrh? We looked at the symbolism of each of these gifts, referring to the myrrh as a foreshadowing of Jesus' death. Anointing a body was part of Jewish custom, and it was their desire to fulfill this ritual that brought the women to the tomb on Easter morning. It was then that they discovered Jesus had risen from the dead. Jesus' shroud or burial cloth was wrapped tightly around him, just like the swaddling clothes Mary wrapped him in when he was a baby. The burial cloths were tight so they would not come off. Imagine how surprised the women who had wrapped them around him were to find them in a pile on the floor when they came to the tomb on Easter morning.

## Believing in Risen Life

After his death and burial, the apostles saw the risen Jesus. They talked with him. They touched him. They ate with him. These things are not done with the dead. They knew he was alive. We believe this still today because we experience his presence in many ways

- How do I see the risen Lord's activity still happening today?
- How can I foster belief in the risen Lord by what I say and do?
- How does this belief change my life, my attitudes, my priorities?
